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Figure 1: Change in level of corruption in past 2 years




Figure 2: How big a problem corruption in the public sector?




Figure 3: Perceptions of corruption, by institution




Figure 5: Government effectiveness at fighting corruption




Figure 6: "Ordinary people make a difference in the fight against corruption"




Figure 7: People's willingness to get involved in the fight against corruption




Figure 8: Would you report an incident of corruption?




Figure 9: Are you familia with Transparency International/Chapter name?
