#### Problems encountered when doing business

Although not ranked among the top concerns, corruption is a problem for about a third of European companies

### **Perceived level of corruption**

A majority of businesses think corruption is widespread in their country



Corruption is widespread 63%

Corruption is rare 32%

Corruption is non-existent 1%
